
The Vicar writes

There is a lot to consider this week, so please read this carefully.

The PCCs of PPT and St Mary's Hennock both met this week, and agreed the plans for Christmas, which you will find on p.6.

We are holding some events outside (weather permitting) this year, so there are options for those who are nervous of crowds inside.

Christingle will be held at PPT on Sun 5 December at 4pm, and there will be no 9.30am service that day.



We reviewed our COVID risk assessment in the light of the latest advice from the Church of England. Infection rates in the South-West are rising, but hospital cases are falling. There is renewed anxiety about a new variant but this has not yet reached the United Kingdom. The PCCs agreed that we would maintain our current practice around Holy Communion. Please continue to sanitise your hands on arriving at church, and feel to wear a face covering or keep a social distance if you wish.

Because of the cold weather we will be keeping doors and windows at PPT closed during services. and rely on the natural ventilation of the building. We will be re-instating the one-way system of entry and exit at PPT: please arrive by the south porch, and leave through the west (tower) door. You can find the full risk assessment at the **Resources section** of the website.

The PCC at PPT Bovey has agreed a new policy around car parking. We appreciate that towns like Bovey do not have enough parking space anywhere- for the school, or surgery, outside homes and for our churches. We are restricting the church car park to users of the church and church room, and access will be closed by a chain at other times. Parking by the church tower will be restricted to those who are disabled. Please respect our neighbours opposite the church and <u>do not park outside their homes.</u>

The Office Pod is now complete, and we are moving equipment out of the old church office space. Thank you to those who donated toward the cost: we raised \pounds 6,300, more than we had hoped. We are looking for a small desk or bookcase, and will be refurbishing the previous office space in the weeks to come.

Finally, amid the secular shopping season of Black Friday and Cyber Monday, let's remember that our Advent hope is focussed on Christ and his promised return. Let us encourage one another to live by a different standard, and walk in His light.

Other very good news is that Jeremy Butcher, who led the work of the Café for many years, has re-joined our team with great enthusiasm as he is now working only part-time for local youth services. Also, just when we needed to make up staff numbers with Jeremy and Mark Sugden for our second evening Angie Blanche sought this opportunity to become a member of our team, also bringing with her very wide professional experience.

We are now as well placed as we could wish to offer the guidance and care that our young people look forward to when they join together for evenings of fun and enjoyment at Pixie Corner.

We have not been able to have our usual fund raising activities this year and we are very grateful to those who have continued to offer financial assistance, particularly our Town Council. Our Trustees met in September, when we held our AGM, and our thanks go to them for their constant input and encouragement. At this time when there are so many pressures on our young people the understanding and sense of togetherness which the Café offers is more vital than ever and we thank you for your support and prayers.

Making Senses of the End of the World: Rev Ian Paul

Sat 4 December 9.30-12.30pm. A morning of teaching on Zoom about what the New Testament says about the end of the world and why it is important for us to understand this well.

This teaching morning will explore the language the New Testament uses about the 'end of the world' (also known as 'eschatology') and why it is so important to understand it properly. We will look at:

- a. The background to this language in Jewish thinking
- b. Jesus' teaching in Matthew 24 and Mark 13
- c. The Rapture—what is it, and does the Bible really teach it
- d. What the New Testament says about 'tribulation'
- e. The beast, the antichrist, and the Millennium in Rev 20
- f. The significance of the State of Israel

We will be debunking some common myths, and seeing what the New Testament really teaches. And we will explore the pastoral importance of getting our thinking right on this important subject. There will be a chance for some interaction and for asking questions.

The session does not require any prior expert knowledge; we will be looking carefully at the text of the New Testament and what is says in its own context. **Ian Paul** is a well-known biblical scholar and teacher. He has written extensively on eschatology and on the Book of Revelation, including the IVP Tyndale Commentary on Revelation, and the Grove booklet *Kingdom, Hope and the End of the World*. Tickets cost £10 and can be booked here.

Pray for the family of John Foulkes, whose funeral is being held at PPT today.


Sat 4 December:: Ps 9, Isaiah 29.15-end
