Discussion Questions:

Icebreaker:

We English talk a lot about the weather. How might we be so absorbed in tomorrow's forecast that we fail to focus on the big picture to do with weather?

In 12:54-56 Jesus warns his listeners that they are missing the big picture of what's going on around them. What does he mean by 'Interpreting the present time'? (Luke 19:41-44 helps on this)

What sort of things might distract us from recognising Jesus for who he really is?

Are verses 57-59 simply a pep talk on neighbourly behaviour? Or, in the context of Luke 12, could this be an illustration of something else?

In 13:1-5 Jesus comments on two recent disasters. Why does he feel he needs to say that these things are not punishments from God?

When people say that suffering is 'unfair', how would we respond?

When Jesus warns his audience (3 & 5) that they too will perish, what is he talking about? Is this scaremongering?

The idea that God might allow people to perish eternally is rejected by many people. How does Jesus explain the justice of this in the parable of the fig tree (6-9)?
