The Governor of the Bank of England said this week that we face 'apocalyptic' price rises: already many are struggling to pay their bills. So this week's challenge from James 2.16 is very timely.

"Faith' that says, "Go in peace, be warmed and filled," without giving people the things needed for the body, what good is that? So also faith by itself, if it does not have works, is dead."(Jas 2.16).

So how should we be responding? First of all we should pray for wisdom, and for courage to put our faith into action. This coming Thursday 26 May is Ascension, when we celebrate that Jesus is Lord of Lords, and King of Kings. We will be holding a Prayer Breakfast (open to all) at 7am in the PPT church room, and a Communion service at 7.30pm in St Mary's Hennock. The days before Pentecost are a time for praying that God's kingdom would come and that the Holy Spirit would renew and revive the church in her mission. Watch out for further details next week.

Discussion Questions:

Icebreaker: How are you and your family feeling the impact of the economic crisis?

Read James 2.14-26. What is the clear and repeated message of this passage? (v.14, 17, 20, 26)

James presses his point home forcefully by arguing with an imaginary and foolish church member (this is a rhetorical style called a diatribe).

What does this individual ('one of you' v 16 believe, and what does he do? What do demons believe (v.19) and what do they do about it?

v.18 is very confusing! The quotation marks have been added to distinguish the objector's words from James' reply. Does the objector think that faith and works can be separate, like different spiritual gifts, which some have and some don't?

James uses two biblical characters to prove his point.

read Joshua 2.1-24. How did Rahab put her faith to action? Would she have acted this way without faith?

In talking about Abraham, James refers to two key passages in Genesis. Read Genesis 15.1-6: Abraham asks God what has happened to God's promise in Gen 12, and God repeats the promise with more detail. How does Abraham respond, and how does God look on Abraham as a result?

Read Gen 22.1-12: Abraham obeys God's strange command to sacrifice Isaac, and God's angel stops him at the last minute. What does God now 'know' about Abraham?

How would you answer someone worried that James 2.24 seems to contradict Romans 3.28? What was the problem ('works of the law') that Paul was addressing in Romans and Galatians? What is the problem that James is addressing?

Application: how should we be preparing to help people 'be warmed and filled' as the economic crisis deepens?

Pray for those in need, and for the local church to put its faith into action.
