Discussion Questions: The Risk of Riches

Icebreaker: What risks do the rising costs of living bring to you and your family? James returns to economic issues (see also 1.9-11, 2.5-7) Read James 4.13-17: who is James addressing here? Are they Christians? What is wrong with planning ahead? How should we plan? What have they forgotten? (vv 14, 17)

read James 5.1-6: Who is James talking to in this passage? Are they Christians? What sort of risks arise from possessing wealth? When does 'saving' become 'hoarding'? v3 What harm will it do? How were these people using their wealth v.5? Compare LK 16.19 How were these people making their wealth? vv 4, 6

Read vv 6-9 How should poor Christians respond to injustice? How will God act to save them? Application: how should we as a church help the poor? cf Acts 4.35, Acts 6
