Bovey Tracey Friends for Ukraine have set up English lessons for our Ukrainian guests. The classes are beginner and intermediate, and are on Tuesday evenings from 6-8pm. They are held in the upstairs room at the Community Food Hub in the middle of Bovey Tracey and are informal and friendly. They are more like a conversation class than anything too formal, although there is some flexible structure and materials. Our Ukrainian visitors are enjoying the classes and making good progress.

We are now hoping a few more volunteers might join us to help with these classes. No particular experience of teaching or English as a Second Language (ESL) is needed, just a friendly and approachable manner. It would not be necessary to be available every week, as we would like to have a pool of people who can help out, and we will probably pull together a rota.
