Today we mourn the death of our beloved Queen. As well as the national televised events and services, we will be providing local means of expressing our sorrow for our loss and our thankfulness for her life of service:

A book of condolence will be available to sign in the church from this Sunday afternoon in the Lady Chapel, and floral tributes can be placed around the Cross in the Courtenay Memorial Garden.

We are now planning a special Commemorative services for Sunday 18 September: these will be at 11am at St Mary's Hennock, and at 3pm at PPT Bovey.

The Royal Family has expressed a wish that planned events should continue, so the Nourish Festival concert tomorrow evening will go ahead, and the regular Sunday and midweek services will continue, with special prayers for King Charles, the Royal Family and our nation at this time of sorrow. We also need to pray for our new Prime Minister. The task facing Liz Truss is immense and whatever our political persuasions we need to pray for her and all in government as they seek to lead and serve the country through these difficult and challenging days.

Our bible passage from Luke 17 this Sunday reminds us that we too are called to be faithful servants of Christ, behaving in such a way that we put no stumbling block in the path of another believer and always ready to forgive fully and freely the one who wrongs us but seeks forgiveness. This is no easy task. Confronted with this challenge the disciples asked Jesus to increase their faith. He reminded them that it wasn't great faith they needed, but rather faith in a great God. With him all things are possible. Let's hold onto that and by his grace live it out daily so that we share his hope and life with others.

Icebreaker: Can you think of a situation where you said or thought 'I could never forgive that'?

What would need to happen for you to do so?

Discussion. Luke 17.1-10.

This passage comprises short sayings of Jesus which Luke has brought together. He may not have known their original historical context but chose to put them together in this way. Jesus says temptation to sin is inevitable but has harsh words for the person through whom it comes (v.1-2). What do you think he has in mind? Can you think of any contemporary examples? How might we watch ourselves in this regard?

Jesus challenges his disciples to forgive others (v.3-4). What limits, if any, does he put on this? In what way might we rebuke a fellow Christian? What are we seeking to achieve when we do so? Confronted with these challenges, Jesus' disciples ask for their faith to be increased (v.5-6). What does Jesus tell them? How might we apply this in practice?

In the last paragraph of this passage, Jesus draws upon the cultural context of his day to illustrate how we should approach our Christian service (v.7-10). What do you think he is saying about the attitude we should have? How will that affect what we do?

Application:

One way of summarising this passage would be to say -

Give no offence - Take no offence - Embrace a whole-hearted faith.

How might we put that into practice in our daily lives?
