Study Questions:

Icebreaker: Have you ever been on a protest Demo? What was it like? Did it make any difference?

Read John 2.13-end, and look at a plan of the Temple of Herod

To what was Jesus objecting in the Temple? (There are many theories, and limited evidence!)

Do you think that Jesus did this at the beginning of his ministry, as John describes, on his final visit to Jerusalem as the Synoptic gospels suggest (Mark 11.15-19), or did he repeat it?

What was Jesus trying to achieve by his action in the Temple? What damage or hurt did Jesus inflict? What did he achieve?

Does Jesus think that the Temple can be reformed? Cf Jn 4.21, Lk 13.34, Mk 13.2,14

The authorities demand a sign - by what authority does Jesus act in the temple? (Consider Jeremiah 7.1-14, Malachi 3.1-4, Zechariah 14.21) and Jn 2.16

What sign does Jesus offer? v19. How is this later misquoted? (Mt 26.60-61) and how is it ultimately fulfilled?

How does the Old Testament help the disciples (and us) understand who Jesus is, and how does Jesus help us understand the full meaning of the Old Testament? Consider vv 17, 22 and Ps 69.1-21

Application:

How does this passage enlarge your image of Jesus - (meek and mild, man of sorrows and ?)

Who or what takes the place of the Temple today for Christians? Jn 1.14, Rev 21.22, 1 Cor 6.19, 1 Pet 2.4-5.

How does this guide us in making protests or seeking reform?

Mon 23 Jan Ps 108, Hosea 2.18-end of 3.

Give thanks for the work of the police, courts and prison services, that justice may be seen to be done, and criminals reformed.

Tue 24 Jan Ps 36, Hosea 4.1-16.

Give thanks for the Community food hub, Citizen's Advice linke and warm space each Tuesday at the Methodist church and pray that many would find the help they need.

Wed 25 Jan: Conversion of St Paul Ps 66, Ezekiel 3.22-end.

Give thanks that the grace of God can convert enemies into friends, and pray for the wounds of the church to be healed and true unity to increase.

Thu 26 Jan Ps 47, Hosea 5.8-6.6.

Give thanks for the work of the Christian Institute, and pray that its efforts may bring the salt and light of gospel truth to bear on contemporary issues: pray for freedoms of speech to be protected.

Fri 27 Jan Holocaust Memorial Day Ps 65, Hosea 6.7-7.2.

Pray for the Christianity Explored course beginning this evening, for people to come and find deeper understanding and living faith in the Lord Jesus. For Graham leading
