Study Questions: **Icebreaker**: How do you cope with constructive criticism? What is the best way to give it?

Read Exodus 18 and compare and contrast it with Exodus 17. Who comes to see the Israelites? Note how Moses spends all day sitting and is weary.

How does Jethro find out about what God has done for Israel? (18.1,8)

How does Jethro respond to the news? (9-12). Why is this significant? (cf Ex 9.16)

What does it mean that Moses and the elders eat with Jethro before the Lord (18.12)

How do we respond to what God has done for us in Christ?

Read Exodus 18.13-27: What is Moses trying to do for the people of Israel? (18.13, 15-16)

What does Jethro advise Moses to focus his efforts upon? (18.20) -cf Acts 6.4)

What qualities are required of those to whom Moses delegates? (18.21 cf Acts 6.3)

Why does Moses accept constructive criticism from Jethro? (18.23-24)

How do we enquire of God and learn his statutes and laws? Jer 31.33,

How might we better organise ourselves to share the burdens of teaching and pastoral care?

Pray for our staff, lay leaders - PCC and small group leaders- for more to be trained and encouraged.
