Study Questions: 1 Corinthians 1.1-9

Ice-breaker

If any of us have belonged to churches where there have been divisions or bad practice, how have these things been handled? Was it done well or badly?

Read Acts 18: 1 – 11

The church in Corinth is born as a result of Paul's ministry. What is the heart of this ministry? (4, 5, 11)

After leaving Corinth, Paul settles in Ephesus where he hears news of issues in Corinth which need addressing. So let's read what he writes:

1 Corinthians 1: 1 – 9

The Corinthian Christians owe a lot to Paul as the one who, under God, has founded their church. Why might he feel (1) that he needs to describe himself as an 'apostle' rather than their 'father figure'? What is distinctive about an apostle? How should this affect our attitude to his letters?

Verse 4: Before addressing difficult issues (10) Paul gives thanks for four things. Why might he choose to do this?

a) Grace (4). How would we explain 'God's grace' to a child?

b) <u>Their enrichment</u> (5). Given the social standing of most of them (26), why is this so striking? In what ways are they rich?

c) <u>Paul's testimony confirmed</u> (6). What exactly was Paul testifying to (Acts 18: 5)? How confident was Paul when he first came to Corinth that anyone would listen to him (see 2:3)? How do we explain the turn-a-round?

What is the essence of Christian testimony? Is it subjective or objective or both? If we had the opportunity to share our testimony, what would we be talking about?

d) <u>Their future assurance</u> (8-9). How can Paul be so sure that these badly behaved Christians will stay the course and one day be 'blameless'?

Is it presumptuous for us to say 'Once saved, always saved'?
