Study Questions: 1 Corinthians 1.10

Ice-breaker: Where do your loyalties lie? (eg a supermarket, newspaper, political party, church, family). What would it take you to change your mind?

Unity sounds a good thing- but do we all need to agree about everything?

Read 1 Cor 1.10-18. After a warm and uplifting opening (1-9) Paul begins to address the problems in Corinth.

How does Paul know what is happening in Corinth, when he is miles away -probably in Ephesus? (1.11, 7.1, 8.1, 16.17)

Paul's response will tackle sexual immorality (ch 5-6), compromise with paganism (8), disorderly worship (11) and spiritual elitism (12-14) lovelessness and heresy (15). Why does Paul start with unity (ch.1-4)?

How are the Corinthians divided? (10-12)

Why do some label themselves as loyal to Paul, others to Apollos, Cephas (Peter) or Christ? How do we label ourselves? Can we avoid it? (cf 1 Cor 11.18-19)

Who is Cephas? (1 Cor 9.5, 15.5) Who is Apollos? (Acts 18.24-19.1) What is Paul's attitude to Cephas (see also Gal 2.11) and Apollos (1 Cor 3.4-6, 16.12)

Had these other leaders deliberately fostered division?

How does Paul challenge these divisive labels? 13-16)

What matters more than by whom or how we were baptised? (14-17)

What is 'the message of the cross'? (18)

What do our non-Christians friends and family think of Christianity?

What does our response to the message of the cross reveal about us and our spiritual destiny?

How does Paul expect that all should 'agree with one another, and be perfectly united in thought'? (1.10, 17)

What power does the message of the Cross possess? (see 1.6, Jn 16.8-11, Rom 12.2)

In what matters should we expect agreement among Christians, or accept disagreement? (see also 1 Cor 15.1-4 'of first importance', Rom 14.1 'disputable matters')
