Collect for 13th Sunday after Trinity

Almighty God, who called your Church to bear witness that you were in Christ reconciling the world to yourself: help us to proclaim the good news of your love, that all who hear it may be drawn to you; through him who was lifted up on the cross, and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

Study Questions: Faith in the Future

Icebreaker: What is the most serious crisis facing the world today/ What worries you/ your friends and family the most?

Read Revelation 6. What sort of literature is Revelation?

What does Apocalyptic mean?

Is it describing the past, present or future?

Read Mark 13.5-13. This has been described as the 'Little Apocalypse'. What similarities do you see with Rev 6.1-11. Also compare Mk 13.24-27 with Rev 6.12-17

Is Revelation teaching us new truths, or new angles on existing truths?

Look at Rev 6.3-8: where do we see the evils of war, famine and disease rampant today? Why are the oil and the wine spared?

Look at Rev 6.9-11 Where do we see persecution of Christians? Do you think that the church is growing locally, or globally?

Look at Rev 6.12-17. What is being described here? Who is the Lamb (v.16)?

Look back to vv 1, 3, 5, 7. What role does the Lamb play in this story?

Look at v.2. What does the white rider with crown and bow symbolise?

(a. Christ and the church spreading the gospel, b) imperialism, c) false religion)

Application: do we believe that the world can save itself, or do we look forward with hope to the return of Christ and his final judgement?

How should we respond to a fearful world? (1 Pet 3.14, Mt 28.16-20)

Mon 4 Sept Ps.126, Haggai.1-11
