Collect for the Eighth Sunday after Trinity

Almighty Lord and everlasting God, we beseech you to direct, sanctify and govern both our hearts and bodies in the ways of your laws and the works of your commandments; that through your most mighty protection, both here and ever, we may be preserved in body and soul; through our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

Study questions on 1 Corinthians 10

Discussion starter: Most of us have probably sadly witnessed the break-up of a marriage within our wider family or of friends. What would we say are the main reasons for separation and divorce?

When Christians drift away from faith in Christ, what sort of things are likely to cause such a falling away?

Have we ever thought of the possibility that we might not continue as Christians?

Read Corinthians 10: 1 - 22

When Paul warns about the dangers of idolatry (7 & 14), what is he referring to? What exactly are the Corinthians doing?

Why might they feel that going to the pagan temple was neither here nor there for Christians?

How does Paul help the Corinthians to see that they are in danger of repeating the Israelites' behaviour in the desert:

1-2: The privilege of 'baptism'

2: The privilege of having Moses as their leader

3-4: The privilege of spiritual food ad drink

How were these privileges equally true for the Corinthians?

And how were the sins of the Israelites being repeated by the Corinthians? -:

- 7: Idolatry
- 8: Sexual immorality
- 10: Grumbling against leaders

12: How do we imagine the Corinthians reacted to this warning? And how do we react?

In 14-22 what is the main reason for not engaging in pagan worship (esp 21)? Why are demons/the devil mentioned as being involved?

22: What does this suggest about the essence of what idolatry is? What sort of things might we be in danger of idolising? (e.g. family, our health, financial security) If we were to lose something/someone important to us with the result that "our whole world collapses", does that suggest that our security/identity has been placed somewhere other than in Christ?

Read 23 – 11:1

23: What new freedom have the Corinthian Christians discovered?
Why is it quite OK for them to eat any food (25-27)?
28: Why would the unbeliever's comment be enough to avoid this food? (See also 32)
What might be the areas of sensitivity for us? (e.g. alcohol; others...?)

33: What is the overall motive in making these difficult decisions?

11: 1: In what sense is the Lord Jesus Christ the supreme example of being willing to forego freedom?
