## Catechism Question of week: Is there more than one God?

**A:** No, there is only one true God -"Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is one. (Deuteronomy 6.4)

## Collect for the Seventeenth Sunday after Trinity

Almighty God, you have made us for yourself, and our hearts are restless till they find their rest in you: pour your love into our hearts and draw us to yourself, and so bring us at last to your heavenly city where we shall see you face to face; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

## Study questions on Numbers 27.1-11 & Numbers 36

Icebreaker: What inheritance or family heirloom do you treasure (or desire) most?

Context: the Israelites are encamped across the Jordan from the promised land. A new census has been conducted, after the first (disobedient) generation has died in the desert.

Read Numbers 27.1-11: what are the daughters of Zelophehad requesting? What is their motivation and attitude?

How does Moses respond? (Contrast his responses at Num 11.10, 14.5, 16.4, 20.6)

What is the purpose of the new law from the LORD? (vv 7-11)

Read Numbers 36: the half-tribe of Manasseh has now been allocated land east of the Jordan (Num 32.33), and a committee set up for allotting inheritances when the Conquest has been completed (ch 34-35)

What is the concern of the family heads of the clan of Gilead (36.1-4)? What is the law of Jubilee? (cf Leviticus 25)

How does Moses respond? (vv 5-9)

How do the daughters of Zelophehad respond to this new, restrictive, ruling? (10-12)

These chapters may not speak directly to our situation in a capitalist economy where few of us work the land or remain in one place for many years, never mind for generations. Nor does it give us straightforward principles for inheritance law.

What advice does scripture give us about earthly inheritances? (Lk 12.13, Heb 11.13-15)

What advice does scripture give us about marriage? (1 Cor 7 esp v.39, 2 Cor 6.14)

Read 1 Peter 1.3-10. What is our true inheritance, and how do we obtain it, and ensure continuing possession?

Give thanks to God for our imperishable inheritance through Christ: why not use the Collect for this Sunday (above)?

## Mon 23 Sep Ps 71, 1 Kings 21.

Give thanks for the Wise Guys group of 11-14s meeting at the Youth Cafe, and pray that new members settle in well and are receptive to learning more about faith: for Angie, Jess and Elizabeth in their leadership

### Tue 24 Sep Ps 73, 1 Kings 22.1-28.

Pray for the gospel of peace to bring reconciliation to long-running feuds and hostilities. for the work of peacemakers and diplomats in the corridors of power.

### Wed 25 Sep Ps 77, 1 Kings 22.29-45.

Give thanks for the work of Choices Crisis Pregnancy Centre, and pray that volunteers may be wisely chosen and well trained to give support to women and partners in distress.

## Thu 26 Sep Ps 78.1-39, 2 Kings 1.2-17.

Give thanks for the weekly men's breakfast, and pray that men will encourage one another to walk with God in their daily lives, and pray more earnestly for the coming of God's kingdom.

## Fri 27 Sep : Ps 55, 2 Kings 2.1-18

Pray for the Friday Friends group for mums, carers and toddlers to flourish and to provide a regular witness to the love of God.

### Sat 28 Sep Ps 76, 2 Kings 4.1-37

Pray that the congregational meeting brings a deeper sense of unity and commitment to the work of the gospel in our community, and to fervent prayer for the Church of England in this critical time.

### Sun 29 Sep Ps 34, Daniel 12.1-4.

Give thanks for God's provision of our daily needs through the Harvest. Pray for deeper awareness of our dependence upon farmers, and for generosity to those struggling with the cost of living, and the ministry of the Homeless in Teignbridge Support (HITS) foodbank.
