



The Vicar writes:

This has been a tumultuous week in the Church of England. The Makin Report has revealed the horrifying abuse perpetrated over decades by John Smyth QC, and the persistent failure of Church of England leaders at many levels to act on what they knew. It has led so far to the resignation of the Archbishop of Canterbury, and more resignations may follow.

How should we respond? We may feel overwhelming sadness, anger or disgust at what is being revealed. This Sunday we will grieve for those whose lives have been scarred by abuse, and lament the shame and disgrace that has fallen on our church. We should repent of any failure on our part to protect the vulnerable, and renew our resolve to treat safeguarding with the utmost seriousness.

This Sunday's services at PPT (and next week at Hennock) have been changed to reflect this urgent need.

Second Sunday before Advent

Heavenly Father, whose blessed Son was revealed to destroy the works of the devil and to make us the children of God and heirs of eternal life: grant that we, having this hope, may purify ourselves even as he is pure; that when he shall appear in power and great glory we may be made like him in his eternal and glorious kingdom; where he is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Study questions** this week are based on the Safeguarding Charity 31:8 material for Safeguarding Sunday. Email Graham if you want the whole study guide.

Icebreaker: What is your experience of safeguarding in church life?

Read 1 Corinthians 12.12-27 How does the image of the body help us understand our mutual responsibility for another as part of a church fellowship?

In vv 22-23 Paul talks about how we treat the parts of the body that are 'weaker' and 'less honourable'. What might this mean in the context of my church community?

One of the reasons that abuse has been tolerated in church is excessive deference and respect given to influential leaders. How does v.24 challenge that?

3. In verse 25 we read about the need to have equal 'concern' or 'care' for one another. How might we relate this to safeguarding and the church?

Who has a responsibility to see and hear what is going on behind the scenes?

How do establish a healthy church culture of mutual concern and alertness, rather than one of deference or prurience and suspicion? What is the difference between gossip and legitimate sharing of concerns?

Look at v.26 How might victims of abuse feel about themselves? How should we protect them?

Discuss how you might respond to one of the scenarios below:

Scenario 1

There is a family in the church with two boys (aged 8 and 6 years old). The last couple of weeks, you have noticed that during services, the boys are often running around unsupervised, and you haven't seen their grown-ups around keeping an eye on them. After the service one day, you see them play fighting forcefully with each other resulting in the younger boy crying.

Scenario 2

There is a woman in her 70s in your congregation. Her partner passed away a couple of years ago and since then her attendance at church is less regular. She has been coming more recently with her son, but she has mentioned that he works weekends and so finds it difficult to always bring her. She has a daughter, but she lives far away and only visits every couple of months. There has been occasion where when speaking to you she has become muddled, and this has made you a little worried.

Scenario 3

There is a girl who attends your church's children's Sunday club who has autism and lacks awareness of physical space. She regularly goes to sit on laps and cuddle adults in the church who are not part of her family. You've noticed that one of the Sunday Club volunteer helpers seems to give more attention to this child than to other children, often giving her gifts, and appears to have a closer relationship with the girl's family than others in the church. You've heard that the helper regularly babysits and helps out when the family needs it.

Pray for a healthy culture to grow in our church fellowship.
