# Letter from the Vicar: A great and mighty wonder!

Many people look forward to Christmas as the most wonderful time of the year.

We can probably predict some parts accurately - the date, the menu (turkey with all the trimmings), and the playlist (traditional carols, Andy Williams, Slade). We may even be able to predict who will give us which presents - the joy of socks from Uncle Albert, or chocolates from Auntie Alice. So where will the wonder be found?

We may wonder about the possibility of a white Christmas in Devon (does a snowflake on Haytor count?), or what lies inside the parcels addressed to us under the Christmas tree.

In our churches every Christmas we celebrate the story of God's greatest gift to all humanity, the coming of Jesus. You may have heard the story many times before, but if you think there is no more wonder to to be found, then learn true wonder from the angels.

The Christmas story is full of angels: Gabriel announces wonderful -and startlingnews to Mary and Joseph. A host of worshipping angels astonish a group of shepherds on the hills near Bethlehem. Angels had long awaited the revelation of what Almighty God had planned. God created the angels to share the heavens with him, while he placed us on this earth, but this gift is exclusively for us.

St Peter described this gift as:

"good news preached to you by the Holy Spirit sent from heaven, things into which angels long to look." (1 Peter 1.12)

If you sometimes feel that life is predictable and dull, that there are no mysteries and wonders left, even at Christmas, then you are disenchanted. So I invite you to unwrap the wonderful gift that angels longed to look into, and to join with them in the joyful praise of Jesus. He is God come to live among us in person. He can fill us with joy and wonder, and restore the purpose, love and glory that we have lost along life's way.

To God on high be glory

Brenda is 88 years old and has vivid memories of her wartime childhood during the Second World War as does her life long friend who has also started to knit for Ukraine

Brenda does most of her knitting in her armchair at home and sometimes she joins the sewing group in the church room.

You may remember that in the last bulletin Brenda asked for donations of wool and she thanks everyone who generously responded and these photos show the result: 72 scarves, 22 hats, 26 pairs of mittens, 8 pairs of booties and a blanket.

These have now been sent to the charity cr2ee who support Moldova and Ukraine.

cr2ee have a warehouse in Exmouth from where the goods are sent by sea ,they have a local 'drop Off' point at Braida Garth, Staplake Lane Starcross EX6 8QT Brenda has done so much knitting that she has already sent two large boxes containing similar items to cr2ee and she is still knitting! 
