Dear friends,

the installation of the new lighting at PPT is now complete, although we still have to set up the different lighting 'scenes'. Our next priority is the church heating. The PCC has agreed that the first phase is to instal electrical under-pew heaters. These are a safe, simple and economical way to keep you warm in the pews, and we estimate this phase will cost about £30,000, but they will not provide warmth in other areas of the church building, which would be addressed in a second phase. We are hoping to raise funds and attract a matching grant of up to £10,000 from a national church fund called 'Give to Go Green'. If you are interested in being part of a small team to raise these funds, please speak to me as soon as possible.

Study questions on Matthew 4.12-25

Icebreaker: Who do you 'follow'? (eg magazine/newspaper columnists, social media). What is the cost of doing so? (e.g subscription fee, embarrassment)

Read Matthew 4.12-25

Why does Jesus withdraw from Galilee? What was he doing in Judaea beforehand? (cf Jn 3.22-24)

Why does Jesus move from Nazareth to Capernaum? (cf Mt 13.54-58)

What is the significance of Galilee and the quotation of Isaiah 9.1-2?

How does Jesus' ministry compare with the ministry of John the Baptist? (compare Mt 3.2 and Mt 4.17). How does it differ? (note especially Mt 4.23)

How does Galilee respond to the ministry of Jesus? (4.25, but also 11.20-24, 13.53-58)

How wide an impact does Jesus have? Are there any areas/towns that Jesus never visits?

Focus on vv 18-22: Why do the men respond to Jesus "immediately"? Had they met Jesus before? (Jn 1.35-41)

What does their obedience cost them?

What does their obedience profit them? (Jn 6.68, Ps 27.4)

How and why does Jesus focus on these four men?

When is Jesus ever alone in the gospel? (Mt 26.37-30)

How does investing his time in them (and the twelve) help to proclaim the Kingdom of Heaven?

What is Jesus calling them to be and to do? (cf Mk 3.14)


What is our calling?
