Our Mission focus for March is Leprosy Mission.

A cure for Leprosy has been available since 1982 but while treatment stops leprosy progressing it can't reverse disability, but the expertise of the Leprosy Mission can restore a clawed hand or damaged eyelid with surgery, and heal ulcers I with effective treatment. However, some disabilities are too severe to be treated.

Leprosy is mainly spread by moisture droplets passed through the air from someone who has leprosy but has not started treatment; it is not hereditary. It usually takes years of being close to an untreated person to catch the disease. 95% of people are thought to be naturally immune but immunity is lowered when there are poor living conditions, illness, poor nutrition, unclean water. The stigma of leprosy persists today and leads to rejection by families and communities and the loss of homes, jobs and hope.

All gifts in the collection plate or using Contactless go to our monthly mission focus. Gifts in yellow Gift Aid envelopes are for the general church funds.

The Electoral Roll is a list of every adult(16+) who regards themselves as a regular worshipping member of a parish church - whether they are able to attend church regularly, or would wish to if health allowed. Every six years all parishes in the Church of England are required to create a fresh electoral roll, so whether you completed form last year or six years ago, everyone now needs to complete a fresh form. At PPT and St Mary's Hennock we also ask some additional (voluntary) questions that help us understand our congregations, and we offer members a list of other members who are willing for their information to be shared locally. Please complete this form by Sunday 13 April.

Ladies Game night at Rora: Rora are holding a Ladies game night on March 29th from 6pm. It will be mainly board or card games and feel free to bring along your favourite game! Please bring some buffet snacks to share.

Spring Clean Sat 12 April: everyone is invited to come and spring-clean the church and church room on the morning of Saturday 12 April. We are planning to erect the marquee on the church room lawn (weather permitting) in preparation for the Palm Sunday united service and lunch on Sun 13 April.

Third Sunday of Lent

Almighty God, whose most dear Son went not up to joy but first he suffered pain, and entered not into glory before he was crucified: mercifully grant that we, walking in the way of the cross, may find it none other than the way of life and peace; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

Study Questions: Matthew 7.1-6

Look at Luke 6.27-37 and compare it with Matthew 5.43-7.6. What is missing from Luke 6 (hint: a whole chapter?) and notice that Luke 6.36-37 parallels Matthew 5.48 followed by 7.1. There is one small difference between Matt 5.48 and Luke 6.36. Do those two features help us to interpret the instruction that we should not judge in case we too are judged?

What do you think Jesus means by 'do not judge'? Isn't judgement hard-wired into our everyday life and essential simply for survival and also for social cohesion?

How does verse 1 fit with verse 6? And how might it relate to Matthew 23, where Jesus repeatedly says 'Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites...'? Or with Acts 5.1-10 (Ananias and Sapphira), Acts 8.9-25 (Simon the Sorcerer) and Acts 13.6-12 (Elymas)?

So what sort of judgement do you think Jesus is talking about? Can you think of particular scenarios where we fall into the trap of indulging in the sort of judging that Jesus had in mind.

What is the antidote to that kind of judging?

When Jesus says 'you too will be judged', who do you think he has in mind as doing the judging?

How might that apply to our judgements about people in the public eye and the news – eg President Putin, President Trump, Mr Netanyahu – or indeed anyone else?
